

This is because the profession was treated with great respect in ancient Egypt ... but only rich children had the chance to train as Scribes. Otrowwise, everyone would have done it! It was a much cleaner job than being a farmer or soldier, and had the additional benefit of the tax exemption (to be able to skip the tax payment to the government.) As hieroglyphs were so difficult to learn, another form of Egyptian writing was as hieroglyphs, but had fewer symbols and was simpler in general. Eventually, the writing system "Demotic" was developed, which did not use images, and was closer to the writing systems of ancient Europe and Asia than the traditional hierogous system. What hieroglyphs used for? The hieroglifos were used for ceremonial purposes (in rituals and religious ceremonies, as funerals or weddings) and in official communications between the Pharaoh and his court. Aversion hieroglyphics were also used to write protection spells in the tombs of the pharaohs and other rich dead people. Hieroglyphics were also very important for the Practice of Magic in ancient Egypt. Despite huge amounts of time being dedicated to the field of research, no breakthrough came in the translation until the discovery of the Rosetta Stone in 1799. Using the artifact, a French scholar named Champollion worked out what each symbol of the system meant and how their meaning was chosen. The upper part of the Stone had a message written in hieroglyphics, with the same message repeated in ¢ÃÂÂdemotic¢Ã (the easiest form of Egyptian writing) and then Greek. This Rosetta Stone is one of the most important discoveries from Ancient Egypt. Rosetta Stone Facts about hieroglyphics: The characters of the Ancient Egyptian alphabet were called ¢ÃÂÂhieroglyphs.¢ÃÂÂThe ¢ÃÂÂhieroglyphs.Due to how difficult the language was to learn, multiple writing systems were developed that became common among the lower classes: hieratic, for priests and religious figures, and demotic, the kind used by the public. However, hieroglyphs were always used in official government documents, and had a secondary purpose for protection spells and religious rituals. Think of it as your math with those, tens, hundreds and thousands of places. You can write a 10 easily using a hieroglyph, but most other numbers require a lot of hieroglyphs. For example, to write 155 you would use the symbols for 10, then five symbols for 10, then five symbols for 10 to read from left to right or left. Look at the characters, especially animals or people, on a line to see what way they are facing. That's the direction you read. Only priests, employees, and craftsmen who carved hieroglyphics really needed to know how to write them or read them. The most common people could not read and write the symbols.
